





#### Water Right in Emergency: Be principled or get practical?

Clarissa Brocklehurst, UNICEF, explained the cluster approach for humanitarian response activities, where aid groups coordinate efforts.



Julie Aubriot, ACF, noted that few organizations are working on both human rights and water and sanitation, and stressed the importance of developing a common language across these groups.



Antoine Delepière, Terre des Hommes, discussed on-the-ground implementation of a rights-based approach, highlighting challenges for community engagement in times of emergency.

#### **Parliamentarians**



Adnan Mohammad Badran, Jordan, emphasized that access to water is a basic human right, which should be implemented by parliamentarians in national laws.



**Köksal Toptan**, Turkish Grand National Assembly, welcomed parliamentarians from around the world, noting the gravity of the global water crisis and important role of effective legislation in water governance.



Alan Meale, UK and Council of Europe, stressed the impacts of climate change on: water availability, aquatic ecosystems, and the occurrence of water disasters.



Narcio Rodriguez, Brazil, called for the creation of a permanent global water parliament, under the aegis of the WWC and UNESCO-International Hydrological Programme (IHP), to coordinate efforts of parliamentarians addressing water issues around the world.



Cho Jin Hyeong, Republic of Korea, argued that drought and desertification cause decreasing vegetation and food availability in Asia, while restoration and prevention lessen stress from cyclical drought and floods.


