Authors of selected papers will be offered an opportunity to make a presentation at the event and to be published in a water resource economics book and in a special edition of a leading international economics journal. There is no registration fee for paper presenters who will only participate in the IWREC 10th annual meeting on August 28 and 29, 2012. Presenters must cover their own travel and accommodation costs. For paper presenters who also wish to participate in the rest of the World Water Week (August 26-31, 2012) there is a possibility to do so at a reduced registration fee.

PAPER SELECTION CRITERIA

- How the paper advances knowledge of/innovation within the subject
- The scientific quality and originality of the subject treatment
- The practical applications of the paper's content
- The capacity of the procedures or practices described to be replicated

SUBMISSION CHECKLIST

- Topic: specify which of the four topics the paper addresses
- Abstract: with brief introduction, analysis/results, and implications for policy or research.
- Full paper in PDF-format
- Author biography (max 1,000 characters including blank spaces)
